NOTIFICATION BY A PUBLIC GAS SUPPLIER OF INTENTION TO EXECUTE WORKS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF HIGH PRESSURE PIPELINES

IN accordance with section 20(1) of the Gas Act 1986 (c.44) the Director General of Gas Supply has received two notices from British Gas plc, a public gas supplier within the meaning of that Act, of its intention to execute works for the construction of a high pressure pipeline for the conveyance of Natural Gas or Substitute Natural Gas as follows:

Copies of the notice, and of the accompanying map delineating the route which the proposed pipeline is to take, may be inspected, free of charge, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday, in the Library of the Office of Gas Supply, Southside, 105 Victoria Street, London

SW1E 6QT (telephone 01-828-0898 for an appointment). Copies may also be purchased from this Library at a cost of £1 for up to and including five pages and £0.10 per page thereafter (including VAT), by personal callers between the times given above, or by postal request made payable to the Office of Gas Supply.

Sections 20(4) and (5) of the Gas Act 1986 provide that the Director General of Gas Supply may give directions as to the capacity of a proposed pipeline and as to the cost of its construction, if satisfied in the light of representations:—

- a) that a demand exists or is likely to arise for the conveyance of gas of, or of a kind similar to, the kind specified in the notice relating to a proposed pipeline; and
- b) that the routes along which the gas will require to be conveyed will severally be, as to the whole or any part thereof, the same or substantially the same as the route or any part of the route so specified.

Any representations as to such matters should be made in writing and delivered to the Director General of Gas Supply, Office of Gas Supply, Southside, 105 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QT in such manner that:—

- a) an indication, in respect of the gas for the conveyance of which a demand may exist or be likely to arise, of:—
 - (i) its origin;
 - (ii) its quantity; and
 - (iii) the rate at which it may be conveyed,
 is delivered within 28 days of the publication of this Notice; and
- b) any other and further representations are delivered within 90 days of publication.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES

NOTICE

TREASURY MINUTE dated 5th March 1990

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read Section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 C.13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with Section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quotas at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 6th March 1990 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:

- I. The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the day the authority applies to borrow or, if the application is before noon three working days before the loan is credited to the account of the authority's banker, the rate in force at 11 a.m. two banking days before credit day;
- II. Different rates of interest shall be charged on such fixed rate loans according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.) or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
