Commencement and citation

- 1 This Scheme:
 - (a) shall come into operation on 26th September 1991;
 - (b) may be cited as the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No 17) Scheme 1991;
 - (c) shall be read as one with the Post Office (Postal Order) Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P5/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No 1)
