(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING)
ORDER 1991

1. The Fife Regional Council propose to make an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2), 3(2) and 124 of and paragraph 20(1) of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting and loading at any time on part of Main Street, Cairneyhill.
3. Exceptions include waiting for the following purposes:—
 - (a) boarding or alighting from vehicles
 - (b) building of demolition operations
 - (c) road maintenance, improvement or reconstruction
 - (d) statutory powers and duties
 - (e) the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications apparatus and
 - (f) bus travel
4. Full details of the proposals are contained in the Order which, together with a plan showing the lengths of road which will be affected and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for wishing to make the Order, may be examined without payment of fee at Fife Regional Council Headquarters, Fife House, North Street, Glenrothes and at Fife Regional Council Area Office, 82 High Street, Dunfermline.
5. Any person who wishes to object to the proposed Order should send details of the grounds for objection in writing to the undersigned by 22nd November 1991.

THE FIFE REGIONAL COUNCIL (UNION STREET,
BURNTISLAND) (STOPPING UP) ORDER 1991

NOTICE is hereby given that Fife Regional Council propose to make an Order under Section 68(1)(b) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984, stopping up the section of road described in the Schedule hereto. The title of the Order is "The Fife Regional Council (Union Street, Burntisland) (Stopping Up) Order 1991."

The existing provisions which provide for One-Way traffic in Union Street, Burntisland will be revoked when the Stopping Up Order comes into force.

A copy of the draft Order and of the plan referred to therein, showing the section of road to be stopped up, together with a Statement of the Council's Reasons for making the Order may be examined at The Fife Regional Council Headquarters, Fife House, North Street, Glenrothes and at Kirkcaldy District Council, Housing Office, 106 High Street, Burntisland, without payment of fee during normal office hours between Friday, 1st November, 1991 and Friday, 29th November, 1991.

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1991

1. THE Fife Regional Council propose to make an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and 124 of and paragraph 20(1) of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on certain lengths of both sides of High Street, Aberdour.
3. Exceptions include waiting for the following purposes:—
 - (a) boarding or alighting from vehicles
 - (b) the loading or unloading of goods
 - (c) building of demolition operations
 - (d) road maintenance, improvement or reconstruction
 - (e) statutory powers and duties
 - (f) the supply of gas, water, electricity or telecommunications apparatus
 - (g) bus travel and
 - (h) by disabled drivers
4. Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a plan showing the lengths of road which will be affected and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for wishing to make the Order, may be examined without payment of fee at Fife Regional Council Headquarters, Fife House, North Street, Glenrothes and at Aberdour Post Office, 43 High Street, Aberdour.
5. Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send details of the grounds for objection in writing to the undersigned by 22nd November 1991.
