The Plan became operative on 24th October 1991, but if any person aggrieved by the Plan desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by Part II of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972, or that any requirement of the said Part II or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the Plan, that person may within six weeks from 8th November 1991, make an application to the Court of Session under Section 232 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1972.
