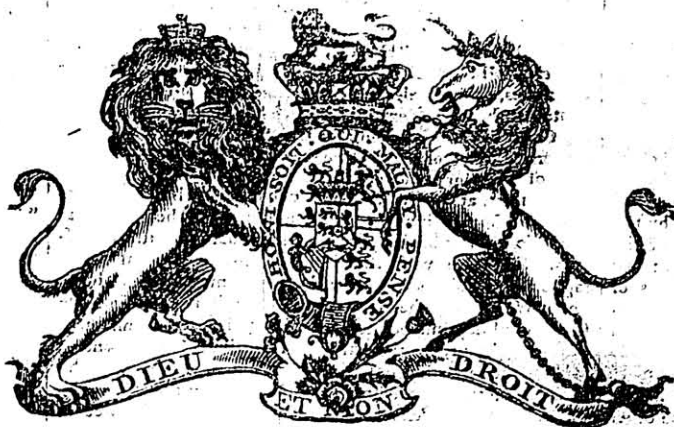

CARLTON-HOUSE—JANUARY 31, 1816.

This day Viscount Castlereagh, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, received the Prince Regent's commands, in consequence of his Royal Highness's detention at Brighton, to accept from the Marquis D'Osmond the letter of credence, by which his Excellency is appointed Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from his Most Christian Majesty at this Court.

On the same day Lord Castlereagh also received from his Excellency the Duke de la Châtre his letters of Recall.

Their Excellencies will have their audiences of reception and leave respectively on his Royal Highness's return to London.
