

SCHEDULE I

Roads in Stirling	Side and Section of Road on which waiting is prohibited at any time
Anderson Place	On the east and west side thereof from its junction with Torbrev Road in a southerly direction for a distance of 10 metres or thereby
Sunnyside	On the east and west sides thereof from its junction with Weaver Row in a southerly direction for a distance of 10 metres or thereby.
Torbrev Road	On the north side thereof from a point 20 metres west of the projected west kerb line of Anderson Place to its junction with Weaver Road, a distance of 125 metres or thereby.

On the south side thereof:

- (1) From its junction with Anderson Place in a westerly direction for a distance of 20 metres or thereby.
- (2) From its junction with Anderson Place in an easterly direction to its junction with Coxithill Road, a distance of 95 metres or thereby.

Weaver Row	On the south side thereof:-
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) From its junction with Sunnyside in a westerly direction for a distance of 59 metres or thereby.</li> <li>(2) From its junction with Sunnyside in an easterly direction to its junction with Borestone Crescent, a distance of 92 metres or thereby.</li> <li>(3) From its junction with Coxithill Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 28 metres or thereby.</li> </ol>

On the north side thereof from its junction with Torbrev Road to its junction with Borestone Crescent, a distance of 206 metres or thereby.

SCHEDULE II

Roads in Stirling	Waiting Restricted to 20 Minutes (Return Prohibited within 40 Minutes), Monday to Saturdays Inclusive
Weaver Row	On the south side thereof from a point 28 metres east of its junction with Coxithill Road in an easterly direction for a distance of 12 metres of thereby.

Footpath linking customs roundabout subway and Old Stirling Bridge - Bridgehaugh Road - footpath linking Bridgehaugh Road and Causewayhead Road and vice versa.
