The Order will introduce the temporary restrictions detailed in the Schedules for the duration of the construction works associated with King Street/Murray Place (Part) Pedestrian Priority Zone. The works will take approximately 12 months to complete. Please note that:

1. Two-way traffic will be maintained from Spittal Street around the Athenaeum to Baker Street.
2. The King Street residents parking zone will be moved to Corn Exchange Road prior to the commencement of the works.
3. Alternative parking for other vehicles will be provided in areas not affected by the works, within the terms of Pedestrianisation Order.
4. Loading/Unloading will only be allowed before 11.00 am and after 4.00 pm on any day, in accordance with Pedestrianisation order.
