The effect of the order will be to prohibit any heavy vehicle from waiting between 1700 hours and 1000 hours from Monday to Saturday, or at any time on Sunday, on any road within the boundary of the City of Aberdeen, except on those lengths of road specified in the schedule to the order, and in accordance with the provisions of the order.

Exemptions will permit waiting -

- (a) for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers;
- (b) for the purpose of loading or unloading goods;
- (c) where necessary in connection with any building operation or demolition; the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance of roads or the supply of gas, electricity, water or telegraphic services.
