ENVIRONMENTAL STATEMENT

THE SECRETARY OF STATE hereby gives notice that he has published an Environmental Statement in connection with variations to the Schemes and Orders in accordance with the provisions of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 as amended by Part VI of the above Regulations.

The purpose of this Environmental Statement is to show the resultant environmental impact that an alternative design would have on the changes proposed for the Bankton Roundabout, the Haddington West junction and the road level in the area north of Gladsmuir village. NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF A SUBMARINE

PIPE-LINE WORKS AUTHORISATION

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY hereby gives notice that he has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works authorisation to be held by Amerada Hess Limited, whose address is 33 Grosvenor Place, London, SW1X 7HY for the construction of a 196.9 millimetre (7.750 inch) pipe-line and the accompanying control umbilical between South Scott Manifold/Wellheads and the Scott Plem within the South Scott Field.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 196.9 millimetre (7.750 inch) pipe-line shall only be used to convey crude oil and the control umbilical shall only be used to convey methanol and chemical injection and control fluid.

The pipe-lines may be used by the holder and with the holder's agreement, and with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons.

Amerada Hess Limited has been appointed operator of the pipe-lines.

PIPE-LINE WORKS AUTHORISATION

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR TRADE AND INDUSTRY hereby gives notice that he has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works authorisation to be held by Shell UK Limited, under its business name of Shell UK Exploration and Production, whose address is Shell-Mex House, Strand, London, WC2R 0DX for the construction of 2 x 200 millimetre ID production flowlines, a 168.3 millimetre (6 inch) gas lift flowline, a 219.1 millimetre (8 inch) water injection flowline, 2 x 9.525 millimetre (3/8 inch) scale inhibitor umbilicals and a 19.05 millimetre (3/4 inch) methanol flowline between the Cormorant Alpha Platform and the Pelican Manifold.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 200 millimetre flowlines shall only be used to convey wellstream fluids - oil, water and gas, the 152.4 millimetre flowline for the conveyance of export quality gas, the 203.2 millimetre flowline for the conveyance of water, the 2 x 9.525 millimetre umbilicals for the conveyance of scale inhibitor and the 19.05 millimetre flowline for the conveyance of methanol.

The pipe-lines may be used by the holder and with the holder's agreement, and with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other persons.

Shell UK Limited has been appointed operator of the pipe-lines.
