In comparison with radiotherapy alone, this combination may increase the response rate and reduce recurrence. Razoxin can produce remissions in previous radio-resistant lesions. Razoxin may be useful alone or in combination with other antimetabolic agents in the treatment of malignant lymphomas, including mycosis fungoides, acute leukaemias, especially the acute blast cell-crisis of chronic myeloid leukaemia, and Kaposi's sarcoma. Experience to date has been in open studies which indicated that the product is of value in patients in whom previous therapies have been unsuccessful. Note: Because of an association between administration of Razoxin and the development of acute myeloid leukaemia or skin epitheliomata, the drug should only be used in the above malignant conditions and then when its administration is essential such as when other treatments have failed.	15th May 1995
