NATURAL HERITAGE (SCOTLAND) ACT 1991

APPLICATION FOR DROUGHT ORDER

NOTICE is hereby given in terms of paragraph 1(2) of Schedule 8 of the Natural Heritage (Scotland) Act 1991, that the Highland Regional Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council) have applied to the Secretary of State for an order under the powers conferred upon him under Section 20 of The Natural Heritage ((Scotland) Act 1991 to modify and suspend the obligation upon the Council in relation to the discharge of compensation water and freshets from Loch Shurrery into the River Forss.

The Council have asked for an Order, which is to apply for a period of six months, to amend The Caithness County Council (Loch Shurrery) Water Order 1955, as follows:

- (1) In Article 6(a) to reduce the quantity of water discharged into the River Forss from 2,500,000 gallons per day (11365 cubic metres per day) to 1,000,000 gallons per day (4546 cubic metres per day).
- (2) In Article 6(b) to suspend the discharge of freshets in the River Forss.

A copy of the map showing the area to be affected by the Order may be inspected by any person free of charge during the hours from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm Monday to Friday, at the Divisional Office of the Council at Miller Street, Wick, Caithness.

Any objection to the application must be lodged within 7 days following publication of this Notice with the Secretary of State, Room 253, (EWWDD), 27 Perth Street, Edinburgh, EH3 5RB.
