May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, his Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Aberdeen, beg leave to approach your Royal Highness, and to present our most lively and heartfelt congratulations on the recent nuptials of your Royal Daughter, the Princess Charlotte of Wales, with his Serene Highness Prince Leopold George Frederick of Saxe Cobourg Saalfeld, &c.

The virtues of the illustrious pair, now united by this sacred tie, afford the most pleasing prospects to the whole British empire, and the expectation of particular satisfaction and delight to your Royal Highness, and to all the other branches of the exalted house of Brunswick.
