WAR-OFFICE—MAY 28, 1816.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 23d regiment of light dragoons being permitted to bear on its standards and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to the regiment, the word "Talavera," in consideration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by that regiment in the battle of Talavera, on the 27th and 28th July 1809.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 28th, or North Gloucester regiment of infantry, being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to the regiment, the word "Albuera," in consideration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by that regiment in the battle of Albuera, on the 16th May 1811.
