To his Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT.

The humble Address of the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the Shire of Ayr.

May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, his Majesty's most faithful and loyal subjects, humbly beg leave to approach the throne with dutiful congratulations upon the auspicious event of the marriage of her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte of Wales to his Serene Highness Prince Leopold of Saxe Cobourg. It is with the greatest satisfaction we anticipate the most happy national consequences from this connection, which we ardently hope may tend to insure to these realms a long succession of Monarchs of that illustrious line, under which so much individual happiness and national prosperity have been enjoyed by those whom Providence has placed under its favoured sway; and whilst we lament the severe indisposition of our beloved Sovereign, we beg leave to assure your Royal Highness of the dutiful attachment of, may it please your Royal Highness, his Majesty's most faithful and loyal subjects, the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the Shire of Ayr.
