QUEEN'S-PALACE—JUNE 18, 1816.

This day the Count de Beroldingen, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from his Majesty the King of Wurttemberg, had his audience of leave of her Majesty; also Monsieur de Neuffer, successor to the Count de Beroldingen in the same character, had his first private audience of her Majesty; to which they were respectively introduced by the Earl of Morton, her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.
