ROADS (SCOTLAND) ACT 1984

THE A95 TRUNK ROAD

BROOMHILL TO GAICH (DETRUNKING) ORDER 1998

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has made the following Order under section 12(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984:-

The A95 Trunk Road (Broomhill to Gaich) (Detrunking) Order 1998, the general effect of which is to provide for the construction of a new length of side road; the improvement of a length of existing road; and the stopping up of a length of road.

Copies of the Order and relevant plan may be inspected free of charge, during business hours, From 8th January 1999 to 19th February 1999 at the offices of The Scottish Office Development Department, Victoria Quay, Edinburgh; and Highland Council, Service Point, The Square, Grantown on Spey.

Any person aggrieved by this Order, who desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions therein, on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 or that any requirement of the said Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of 8th January 1999 make application to the Court of Session for the suspension of the operation of, or the quashing of the order or any provision contained therein.

DUNDEE CITY COUNCIL (VARIATION OF WAITING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 1999

Dundee City Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 for the purpose of varying the provisions of several Waiting Restriction Orders affecting the City. The effect of the Order is as set out in the Schedule below.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which together with plans showing the lengths of road affected and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours and without payment of fee at the following addresses:-

SCHEDULE

1. To improve sightlines and/or protect accesses in Ann Street/ Powrie Place, Arklay Street, Cardross Place, Annfield Road, Daniel Street, East Henderson's Wynd, Hyndford Street/Perth Road, Roseangle, Seafield Road, Arbroath Road/Dalkelth Road/Robson Street/Kennilworth Avenue, Broughty Ferry Road, Montgomerie Crescent, and the following streets in Broughty Ferry viz, Brook Street, Dalhousie Road, Fort Street, Gray Street, Long Lane and Seafield Road/Davidson Street/Stanley Road.

2. To relieve congestion in Artillery Lane, Edward Street, Lochee Road, Powrie Place, Catherine Street/Dundonald Street/Harriet Street/Eliza Street/Mollison Street, Mains Loan, St. Roque's Lane

and Long Lane, Broughty Ferry.

3. To improve access to the remaining parking spaces in the east leg of Euclid Crescent.

4. To create a turnover of parked vehicles adjacent to business premises in Blinshall Street and Wallace Street.

5. To relax restrictions following junction amendments at Clepington Road/Argyle Street/Mains Loan.

6. To relax unnecessarily severe restrictions in Dundonald Street/ Albert Street, Cardean Street, Park Avenue, Arthursstone Terrace, Lyon Street, West Lyon Street, Morgan Street and Raglan Street.

7. To redescribe restrictions without altering available parking space following alterations to road layouts and/or pedestrianisation in Argyle House Access Road, Castle Street, Commercial Street, Crichton Street, Dock Street/Whitehall Crescent, High Street, Horse Wynd, Peter Street, Rankine's Court, Reform Street and Seagate.

8. To delete reference to lengths of road which have been stopped-up or converted to footpath in Lindsay Street, Marketgait Service Road and Overgate Lane.

EAST LOTHIAN COUNCIL (WINTON PLACE, TRANENT) (VARIATION OF ONE WAY) TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 1999
