

THE FALKIRK COUNCIL (ON-STREET PARKING SPACE FOR DISABLED PERSONS) (REVOCATION) (NO 2) ORDER 1999

The Falkirk Council propose to make an Order under Sections 32(1) and 35(1) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which will remove the disabled persons parking spaces in Kendieshill Avenue, Maddiston.

THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (GLEBE STREET, INVERNESS)

(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACE) (CONTROL OF USE) ORDER 1998

The Highland Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1 (as read with Section 2), 19, 35 and 38 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf has made the following Order:-

 The Order may be cited as The Highland Council (Glebe Streets, Inverness) (Off-Street Parking Place) (Control of Use) Order 1998.
The nature of the Order is to enable the Glebe Street car park to be made available for public parking and to control the use of said car park by way conditions ready in force within the town.

Copies of the Order as made and confirmed and of the accompanying plan have been deposited at the office of the Highland Council Service Point, 23 Church Inverness, and may be inspected there, free of charge, from Monday to Friday during normal office hours.

The effect of the Order is stated in the Notice 68 in *The Edinburgh Gazette* Number 24523 dated 18th December 1998 and in *The Inverness Courier* on 18th October 1998.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from 22nd January 1999 apply to the Court of Session for this purpose.
