ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 THE ABERDEEN CITY COUNCIL (FOUNTAINHALL ROAD/KING'S GATE CORRIDOR, ABERDEEN) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 1999

Aberdeen City Council proposes to make "The Aberdeen City Council (Fountainhall Road/King's Gate Corridor, Aberdeen) (Traffic Management) Order 1999" under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the order will be as follows (please note that a single

road may be affected in various ways):-

(1) to introduce a bus lane, operational between 0730 hours and 0930 hours and also between 1600 hours and 1830 hours on any day except Sundays, on the east side of the carriageway of Fountainhall Road extending from its junction with Albert Lane southwards for a distance of 50 metres or thereby;

(2) to introduce a prohibition of waiting at any time on certain lengths of the roads specified in the schedule hereto (including

some loading restrictions - see below);

(3) to introduce a prohibition of waiting between 0700 hours and 1900 hours on way day except Sundays on certain lengths of King's Gate:

(4) to introduce a prohibition of waiting for more than 45 minutes at any one time on any day except Sundays (no return within 15 minutes) on the west side of Fountainhall Road from a point 16 metres or thereby south of Queen's Lane North southwards for a distance of 23 metres or thereby;

(5) to introduce a one-way requirement an Moray Place, requiring that vehicles proceed in a southerly direction only on that length of Moray Place between its junction with King's Gate and a point 10 metres or thereby south of that junction; and

(6) to prohibit right-turns from King's Gate into Moray Place.

The usual exemptions would apply in relation to all waiting restrictions. Exemptions are for picking up and setting down passengers, loading or unloading, orange badge holders, and vehicles engaged in authorised roadworks being carried out on what would otherwise be a restricted kerbside, except that there will be no exemption for loading, or for orange badge holders, between 0730 hours and 0930 hours and also between 1600 hours and 1830 hours, on any day except Sundays, on both sides of King's Gate from Oakhill Road eastwards to Richmondhill Road, and also on the east side of Fountainhall Road from Albert Lane southwards to Queens Cross. Queries on any of these points should be directed to the numbers given below.

Full details of all the proposals are to be found in the draft order, which, together with maps showing the intended measures and an accompanying statement of the Council's reasons for promoting them, may be examined during normal office hours on weekdays between Monday 1st February 1999, and Monday 1st March 1999, in the offices of the Council's Roads Section on the second floor of

St. Nicholas House, Broad Street, Aberdeen.

Anyone wishing to object to the proposed order should send details of the grounds for objection in writing to the undersigned during the statutory objection period which also runs from 1st February until 1st March inclusive. Any objection should state (1) the name and address of the objector, (2) the matters to which it relates, and (3) the grounds on which it is being made.

WHITECAIRNS - 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT

Aberdeenshire Council has made "The Aberdeenshire Council (Whitecairns) (50 mph Speed Limit) Order 1999" under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the order is to prohibit any person from driving, or causing or permitting to be driven any vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 mph on the B999 Aberdeen to Tarves road at Whitecairns from a point 235 metres south of its junction with the unclassified 24C Whitecairns to Redmoss road northwards for a distance of 465 metres.
