Notice is hereby given that East Lothian Council have made an Order in terms of Section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to vary the "Lothian Regional Council (Various Roads, Dunbar, East Lothian) (Prohibition and Restriction on Waiting and Loading) Order 1995" to complement the changed road geometry following Environmental Improvement works carried out by the Council.

This order will come into operation on 25th October 1999.

The Notice of proposal to make this Order was advertised in the *East Lothian Courier* of 20th August 1999, *East Lothian News* of 20th August 1999 and in *The Edinburgh Gazette* of 20th August 1999 (Issue Number 24659). The effect of the Order is as described in these Notices.

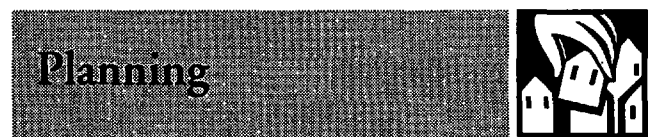
