The following Address has been presented to her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte Augusta and his Serene Highness the Prince Leopold of Saxe Cobourg; which Address they were pleased to receive very graciously:

Unto her Royal Highness Princess Charlotte Augusta and his Serene Highness Leopold George Frederick, Duke of Saxe, Margrave of Meissen, Landgrave of Thuringuen, Prince of Cobourg of Saalfeld.

The humble Address of the Freeholders, Heritors, and Justices of Peace of Argyllshire, in General Meeting assembled.

*May it please your Royal and Serene Highness,* WE, his Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Freeholders, Heritors, and Justices of Peace of Argyllshire, impressed with the feelings of hereditary loyalty and warm attachment to the illustrious house of Brunswick, and of peculiar interest in whatever regards the happiness of your Royal Highness, beg leave to approach your Royal and Serene Highness with our most sincere and cordial congratulations upon your happy union; an event which has diffused the most universal joy throughout his Majesty's dominions, as affording to your Royal and Serene Highness every prospect of domestic happiness, and to his Majesty's subjects an additional guarantee of the continuation of those blessings which, under the mild and paternal government of the present royal line, they have so long and so conspicuously enjoyed. That those pleasing anticipations may be fully realized, as it is the sincere wish, so ever will it be the ardent prayer of, may it please your Royal and Serene Highness, the Freeholders, Heritors, and Justices of Peace of Argyllshire.
