WESTMINSTER—JUNE 20, 1817.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.

An act to authorize the rewarding Officers of the Customs for their services in preventing illicit distillation in Scotland, under an act passed in the last session of Parliament.

An act to repeal two acts passed in the 54th and 55th years of his present Majesty, relating to the office of the Agent-General, and for transferring the duties of the said office to the offices of the Paymaster-General and Secretary at War.

An act to regulate the trade to and from the places within the limits of the charter of the East India Company, and certain possessions of his Majesty in the Mediterranean.

An act to continue until the 15th day of June 1818, an act of the 52d year of his present Majesty, for the more effectual preservation of the peace, by enforcing the duties of watching and warding.

An act to explain and amend an act of the 53d year of his present Majesty, relating to tolls on carriages used in husbandry, and to remove doubts as to exemption of carriages, not wholly laden with manure, from payment of toll.

An act to extend certain provisions of the acts of the 36th and 52d years of the reign of his present Majesty, to matters of charity and friendly societies.

And to several English acts, and eleven private acts.
