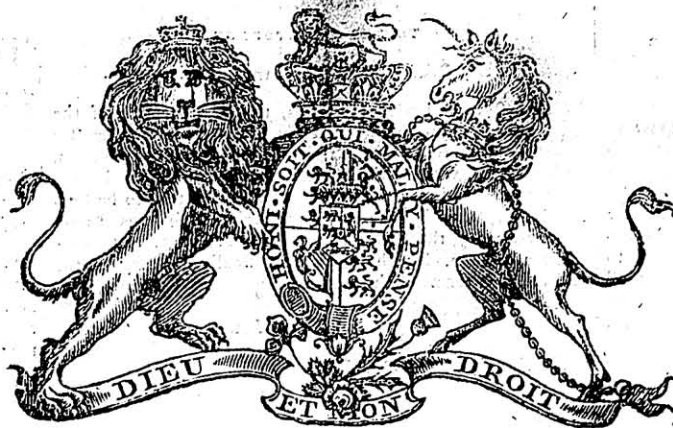

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for granting the dignity of a Baronet of the said United Kingdom to Sir Humphry Davy, of Grosvenor Street, in the parish of Saint George, Hanover Square, in the county of Middlesex, Knight, Doctor of Laws, and to the heirs-male of his body lawfully begotten.
