WHITEHALL—DECEMBER 26, 1818.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for granting to Field-Marshal his Grace the Duke of Wellington, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, the office of Master-General of his Majesty's Ordnance of the United Kingdom.
