

CALTON AND BRIDGETON BREAD SOCIETY.

THE Managers of the CALTON and BRIDGETON BREAD SOCIETY, finding that a considerable number of the Members are in arrears for Bread, and that it is contrary to the third article of the Society, which is of the following tenor,—“That every share paid into the funds, shall entitle the Member to one Quartern Loaf per week, to be paid on delivery, at the price fixed by the Committee; which fund shall be applied for purchasing grain, flour, &c. and carrying on the business of the Society. The Committee shall always pay ready money for all their articles, and shall not be allowed to use the credit of the Society for any purpose whatever;” they (the Managers) therefore hereby intimate, that no Bread can or will be delivered unless immediate payment be made, as the Bakers have to account in Cash every evening for the quantity delivered. They also intimate to the Public and all concerned, that, in terms of the said article, all purchases of Grain or other articles for behoof of the Society are immediately paid in Cash, and that no person is empowered to use the credit of the Society, or any of its Members, for any purpose whatever.
