WHITEHALL—August 24, 1819.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to nominate and appoint Robert Kerr, Esq. (commonly called Lord Robert Kerr), to be Secretary to the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, in the room of William Borlase, Esq. deceased.

WAR-OFFICE—August 23, 1819.

15th Regiment of Light Dragoons—Brevet Major Skinner Hancox to be Major, by purchase, vice Cochrane, who retires.

21st—Frederick Charles Ganning, gent. to be Cornet, by purchase, vice Smoke, who retires.

5th Regiment of Foot—Captain Frederick William Kysh, from the 68th foot, to be Captain of a company, vice Pinckney, who exchanges.

90th—H. H. Lewis, gent. to be Ensign, without purchase, vice Frizell, promoted; dated March 1, 1817.

50th—Hospital-Assistant David Williams to be Assistant-Surgeon, vice Brown, promoted on the Staff.

61st—Lieutenant William Sayer, from the half-pay of the regiment, to be Lieutenant, vice Thomas Williams, who exchanges, receiving the difference.

68th—Captain George Pinckney, from the 5th foot, to be Captain of a company, vice Kysh, who exchanges.

73d—Surgeon Edward Owen, from the half-pay of the 4th West India regiment, to be Surgeon, vice John Harding Walker, who exchanges.

78th—Captain Arthur O'Keefe, from the half-pay of the 6th foot, to be Captain of a company, vice William McKenzie, who exchanges.

Rifle Brigade—Lieutenant-Colonel John Duffy, from half-pay of the regiment, to be Lieutenant-Colonel, without purchase.

Royal Staff Corps—Brevet Colonel William Marlay, from the half-pay of the 3d West India regiment, to be Lieutenant-Colonel, without purchase.

2d West India Regiment—Captain James Chisholm, from the Royal African Corps, to be Captain of a company, vice William Armstrong, who retires upon the half-pay of the Royal African Corps.

HOSPITAL STAFF—Staff-Surgeon James Weir, M. D. to be Physician to the forces, vice Mackenzie, deceased. Assistant-Surgeon Joseph Brown, from the 50th foot, to be Surgeon to the forces, vice Weir. Assistant-Surgeon James

Johnston, M. D. from half-pay of the 4th West India regiment, to be Assistant-Surgeon to the forces, vice Alexander D. Anderson, whose appointment has not taken place. All dated August 12, 1819.

MEMORANDA.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the following regiments being permitted to bear on their colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to those regiments, the distinctions under mentioned, viz.

2d (or Queen's Royal) Regiment of Foot, the words "Vittoria," "Pyrennees," "Nivelle," and "Toulouse," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment at the battle of Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; in the Pyrennees, in the month of July 1813; at Nivelle, on 10th November 1813; and in the attack of the position covering Toulouse, on 10th April 1814.

83d Regiment of Foot, the words "Talavera," "Fuentes d'Honor," "Ciudad Rodrigo," "Badajoz," "Salamunco," "Vittoria," "Nivelle," and "Orthes," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the regiment at the battle of Talavera, on 27th and 28th July 1809; at Fuentes d'Honor, in the month of May 1811; at Ciudad Rodrigo, in the month of January 1812; at Badajoz, on 16th March 1812; at Salamanca, on 22d July 1812; at Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; at Nivelle, on 10th November 1813, and at Orthes, on 27th February 1814.

The commission of Major Molesworth, of the 47th foot, has been antedated to 3d July 1816, but he has not been allowed any back-pay.

The reappointment of Lieutenant Hill to the full-pay of the 88th foot, has been antedated to 24th March 1817, but he has not been allowed any back-pay.
