WESTMINSTER—DECEMBER 11, 1819.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to an Act agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said act, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to
An act to prevent the training of persons to the use of arms and to the practice of military evolutions and exercise.

MEMORANDA.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, to approve of the 7th regiment of foot (or Royal Fusiliers) being permitted to bear on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have been heretofore granted to the regiment, the words, "*Talavera*," "*Badajoz*," "*Salamanca*," "*Vittoria*," "*Pyrenees*," "*Orthes*," and "*Toulouse*," in commemoration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the regiment at the battle of Talavera, on 27th and 28th July 1809; at the siege of Badajoz, on the 16th March 1812; at the battle of Salamanca, on 22d July 1812; at Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; in the Pyrenees, in the month of July 1813; at Orthes, on 27th February 1814; and in the attack of the position covering Toulouse, on 10th April 1814.

The commission of Captain Maclean, 86th foot, has been antedated to 30th June 1817, but he is not to be allowed any back-pay.

The commission of Lieutenant Mellis, 24th foot, has been antedated to 26th June 1818, but he is not to be allowed any back-pay.

The re-appointment of Ensign Ridge, to full-pay 47th foot, has been antedated to 25th May 1815, but he is not to be allowed any back-pay.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased to approve of Deputy Commissary-General Aymer being dismissed his Majesty's service, in consequence of a charge having been alleged against him of his having improperly and corruptly received for his own use large sums of money from contractors for supplying the troops in the Peninsula, and that he has failed to attend before the Comptroller of

Price Sevenpence.
