His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been pleased, by letters-patent under the sign-manual of his Royal Highness and the great seal of the Order, to dispense with all the statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to installation; and to give and grant unto the Most Noble Hugh Duke of Northumberland, Knight Elect of the said Order, and duly invested with the ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, as if the said Duke had been formally installed; any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

WESTMINSTER—DECEMBER 18, 1819.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, for declaring his Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for continuing to his Majesty certain duties on malt, sugar, tobacco, and snuff in Great Britain, and on pensions, offices, and personal estates in England, for the service of the year 1820.

An act to authorize Justices of the Peace in certain disturbed counties to seize and detain arms collected or kept for purposes dangerous to the public peace, to continue in force until the 25th day of March 1822.
