WESTMINSTER—JUNE 15, 1821.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by his Majesty, for declaring his Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act to improve the land revenues of the Crown and of his Majesty's Duchy of Lancaster, and for making provisions and regulations for the better management thereof.

An act to regulate the proceedings in the civil side of the Court of King's Bench, and also in the Court of Common Pleas, and in the pleas or common law side of the Court of Exchequer in Ireland.

An act to explain an act, made in the 14th year of his late Majesty King George the Third, for explaining an act made in the 12th year of Queen Anne, intituled "An act to reduce the rate of interest without any prejudice to parliamentary securities."
