Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Admiral of the White Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet, the offices or places of Vice-Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and Lieutenant of the Admiralty thereof, and also of Lieutenant of the Navies and Seas of the said United Kingdom, in the room of Admiral Sir William Young, deceased.

His Majesty has also been pleased to direct, that letters-patent should pass the Great Seal, granting unto William Earl of Northesk, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Admiral of the White Squadron of his Majesty's Fleet, the offices or places of Rear-Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the Admiralty thereof, and also of Rear-Admiral of the Navies and Seas of the said United Kingdom, in the room of Admiral Sir James Saumarez.

MEMORANDUM.

His Majesty has been pleased to approve of the 61st regiment of foot bearing on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the regiment, the word "Talavera," in commemoration of the distinguished conduct of the corps at the battle of Talavera on the 27th and 28th July 1809.
