HIS MAJESTY having been pleased to fix the hour of Twelve o'clock To-morrow, the 15th of August, for his landing at Leith, the Procession, formerly ordered by the Edinburgh Gazette Extraordinary of the 10th instant, will be ready to move off from Queen Street, at Ten o'clock, in the order therein prescribed, with these alterations.—

1st, That the attendance of the Peers is not expected.

2d, That the Lord-Lieutenant of Mid-Lothian, on horseback, will follow, instead of preceding the Carriages of the Officers of State.

3d, That after the Keys of the City shall have been delivered to his Majesty, the Carriage of the

Lord Provost will fall into the Procession immediately behind the Lord-Lieutenant of the County of Mid-Lothian, and the Carriages with the Magistrates of Edinburgh will fall in behind the Deputy-Lieutenants of the County.
