## CEREMONIAL

TO BE

OBSERVED ON THE OCCASION

OF

HIS MAJESTY'S PROGRESS

FROM

THE PALACE OF HOLYROOD TO VIEW THE CASTLE  
OF EDINBURGH,

On Thursday, the 22d of August 1822.

**T**HE Procession will form in the Court-Yard in front of the Palace of Holyrood, with its Head so far advanced on the Street of the Canongate as to admit of his Majesty's Carriage being drawn up in its proper place at the Great Gate of the Palace, when the Procession is completely arranged. The whole will be in their proper stations, ready to move off at two o'clock, in the following order.—

Squadron of Mid-Lothian Yeomanry, six abreast.  
Division of Marischall's Guard, twelve abreast.  
Band.  
Detachment of Scots Greys, six abreast.  
Two State Trumpeters.

The Procession, thus formed, will proceed up the Canongate and High Street to the Castle Hill. On reaching the Castle Gate, the leading squadron of Mid-Lothian Yeomanry, followed by the first division of the Marischall's Guard of Highlanders and detachment of Scots Greys, will turn to its left, and will proceed by the back of the Scaffolding on the South side of the Castle-hill, until the head of the Column shall reach the Eastern extremity of the Scaffolding, when it will halt and front.

Marchmont Herald, on reaching the Castle Gate, will announce to the Governor of the Castle the approach of his Majesty. He, with the Trumpeters who precede him, followed by the whole of the rest of the Procession in front of the King's Carriages, will then turn to the right, and proceed behind the Scaffolding on the North Side of the Castle-Hill, until the front of the Column shall reach the Eastern extremity of the Scaffolding, when it will halt; the whole forming up close, so as not to impede the approach of the King's Carriages to the Castle Gate.

On coming up to the Gate, the King's Carriages will turn to the left, the Heads of the Horses being thus towards the South. The leading Carriages will move on behind the Scaffolding on that side of the Castle Hill, so as to admit of his Majesty's Carriage halting with its side to the Castle Gate.

When the front of the Detachment of Scots Greys in rear of the King's Carriage shall reach the Entrance to the Castle-Hill, that Detachment and the Troop in its rear will halt.

While his Majesty is in the Castle, the Procession will be again formed, with its head fronting the Lawn-Market, and be ready to move off on his Majesty's entering his Carriage, in the same order in which it advanced to the Castle, with this difference

only, that the Squadron of Mid-Lothian Yeomanry, Division of Constable's Guard of Highlanders, and Detachment of Scots Greys, which formed the Rear-guard in advancing, will become the leading Division of the Procession in its return to the Palace, while the Squadron of Mid-Lothian Yeomanry, Division of Marischall's Highland Guard, and Detachment of Scots Greys, which led the Procession in the approach to the Castle, will form the Rear-guard in its return to the Palace.

The Procession, on reaching Bank Street, will turn down that street, and crossing the Mound to Princes Street, will there turn to its right, and proceed by Waterloo Place to the Palace of Holyrood.

The procession will be conducted under the orders of Lieutenant-Colonel Smith, by direction of the Lord Lyon.

The Persons who are to form any part of the Procession will enter the Court of the Palace by the New Road from the Abbeyhill; but no Carriages can be admitted.

Should the Procession, from the state of the weather, or other cause, be postponed, this will be announced by two Guns fired from the Castle, repeated by two from the Calton-Hill.
