## CARLTON-HOUSE—NOVEMBER 22, 1822.

This day the Count Saint Martin D'Aglié, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sardinia, had audience of his Majesty, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign, and Mirza Mohammed Saleh, appointed on a special mission from the King of Persia, had audience of his Majesty, to deliver his credentials; to which audiences they were respectively introduced by the Right Honourable George Canning, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.
