WESTMINSTER, MARCH 16, 1824.

**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act to carry into effect a Convention relating to Austrian loans.

An act for granting to His Majesty rates of postage on the conveyance of letters and packets to and from Buenos Ayres, or any other port or ports on the Continent of South America.

An act to indemnify such persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and for extending the time limited for those purposes respectively, until the 25th day of March 1825, to permit

such persons in Great Britain as have omitted to make and file affidavits of the execution of indentures of clerks to attorneys and solicitors, to make and file the same on or before the 1st day of Hilary Term 1825, and to allow persons to make and file such affidavits, although the persons whom they serve shall have neglected to take out their annual certificates.

An act to continue, until the first day of July 1827, two acts of His present Majesty, for the appointment of Commissioners for inquiring into the collection and management of the public revenue.
