WESTMINSTER, MARCH 23, 1824.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for continuing to His Majesty, for one year, certain duties on sugar, tobacco, and snuff, foreign spirits, and sweets, in Great Britain; and on pensions, offices, and personal actates in England and for receiving the contributions sonal estates in England; and for receiving the contributions

of persons receiving pensions and holding offices, for the service of the year 1824.

An act for transferring several annulties of four pounds per centum per annum into annuities of three pounds ten

shillings per centum per annum.

An act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the
