WESTMINSTER, MARCH 31, 1824.

HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An act for the more effectual suppression of the African slave trade.

An act for the more effectual recovery of penalties before Justices and Magistrates on conviction of offenders, and for facilitating the execution of warrants by constables.

An act for the better maintenance, employment, and regulation of the poor of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, and for remaining or schulding the workhouse these and for repairing or rebuilding the workhouse there.
