WHITEHALL, October 8, 1824.

The King has been pleased to direct letters-patent to be passed under the Great Seal, granting the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland to the Right Honourable Percy Clinton Sydney, Viscount Strangford, His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Sublime Ottoman Porte, and the heirs-male of his body, lawfully begotten, by the name, stile, and title of Baron Strangford, of Clontarf, in the county of Dublin.

MEMORANDUM.

His Majesty has been pleased to approve of the 41st Regiment of Foot bearing on its colours and appointments, the word

"Niagara,"

in commemoration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the Regiment in the capture, by assault, of the American Fort Niagara, on the 19th December 1813, and also by the Flank Companies of the Regiment in action with the enemy, on the 25th July 1814, at Lundy's Lane, near the Falls of Niagara.

His Majesty has also been pleased to approve of the 82d Regiment of Foot bearing on its colours and appointments, in addition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the Regiment, the words

"Vimiera,"
"Vittoria,"
"Pyrene,"
"Nielle," and
"Orthes,"

in commemoration of the distinguished conduct of the Regiment in the battle of Vimiera, on 21st August 1808; at Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; in the Pyrene, in the months of July and August 1813; at Nielle, on 10th November 1813; and at Orthes, on 27th February 1814.

28th—Captain Robert Nicholl, from half-pay 25th light dragoons, to be Captain, vice Mageniz, appointed to the 82d foot.

31st—Lieutenant D. B. T. Dodgin, from the 66th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Thomas Beckham, who retires upon half-pay 61st foot.

66th—Lieutenant Kenneth Tolmie Ross, from half-pay 61st foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Dodgin, appointed to the 31st foot.

82d—Captain Henry Arthur Mageniz, from the 28th foot, to be Captain, vice Brutton, appointed Sub-Inspector of the Militia in the Ionian Islands. All dated September 30.

3d Royal Veteran Company—Captain William Pilkington, from the Veteran Companies intended for Service at Newfourdlard, to be Captain, vice Robert Hall, who retires upon half-pay 103d foot; dated September 2.

Veteran Companies for Service at Newfoundland—Lieutenant Stephen Rice, from half-pay 34th foot, to be Lieutenant, vice Dunne, whose appointment has not taken place; dated September 30, 1824.

BREVET.

Captain William Pilkington, of the 3d royal veteran battalion, to be Major in the Army; dated August 12, 1819.

MEMORANDA.

The Christian name of Major Paterson, of the 97th foot, is Joseph, and not Thomas, as heretofore stated.

The Christian names of Lieutenant Taylor, of the 78th foot, are Thomas John, and not Thomas Medlicott.

The appointments of Captain Smith and Assistant-Surgeon Dillon were to the 3d, and not 2d, Royal Veteran Battalion, as stated in the Gazette of the 2d instant.
