The King has been pleased to direct letters-patent to be passed under the Great Seal, granting the dignity of a Baron of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland to the Right Honourable Percy Clinton Sydney, Viscount Strangford, Hs Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Sublime Ottoman Porte, and the heirs-male of his body, lawfully begotten, by the name, stile, and title of Baron Strangford, of Clontarf, in the county of Dublin.

MEMORANDUM.

His Majesty has been pleased to approve of the 41st Regiment of Foot bearing on its colours and appointments, the word

" Niegara,

in c mmemoration of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the Regiment in the capture, by assault, of the American Fort Niagara, on the 19th December 1813, and also by the Flank Companies of the Regiment in action with the enemy, on the 25th July 1814, at Lundy's Lane, near the Falls of Niagara.

His Majesty has also been pleased to approve of the 52d Regiment of Foot bearing on its colours and app intments, in ad lition to any other badges or devices which may have heretofore been granted to the Regiment, the words

- " Vi niera," " V ttoria,"
- " Pyrene s,"
- " Ni elle," and " Orthes,"

in commemoration of the distingui hed conduct of the Regiment in the battle of Vimiera, on 21st August 1808; at Vittoria, on 21st June 1813; in the Pyren e, in the months of July and August 1 13; at Nivelle, on 10th November 1813; and at Orthes, on 27th February 1814.
