The King has been pleased to nominate and appoint John Tasker Williams, Esq. to be His Majesty's Commissary Judge, in the room of Edward Gregory, Esq. deceased, to the several Mixed Commissions established at Sierra Leone, under the Treaties and Coventions between His Majesty and the King of the Netherlands, His Majesty and the Catholic King, and His Majesty and His Most Faithful Majesty, for the prevention of the illegal traffick in slaves, and pursuant to the several Acts of Parliament passed for carrying those Treaties and Conventions into effect.

The King has also been pleased to nominate and appoint William Sharp MacLeay, Esq. to be His Majesty's Commissioner of Arbitration, in the room of Robert Francis Jameson, Esq. to the Mixed British and Spanish Court of Commission established at the Havannah, under the Treaty between His Majesty and the Catholic King, concluded at Madrid, on the 23d of September 1817, and pursuant to the Acts of Parliament for carrying that Treaty into effect.
