**T**HIS day Mr Rufus King, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America, and Señor Hurtado, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Republic of Columbia, had audiences of His Majesty to deliver their credentials; to which they were respectively introduced by the Right Honourable George Canning, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.
