"It stands on the north east point of the grounds com-ing out from the Syrodde (the most easterly næze of Les-soe), in six fathoms water, one Danish mile, N. E. by com-pass, from the south easterly sea mark on the Trindeln. "It consists of a pitched beam, with a large broom at the top, about 15 feet above the surface of the water."
