ALEXANDER MARJORIBANKS, Junior, Builder in Edinburgh.

AT the meeting for the election of a Trustee on the sequestrated estate of the said Alexander Marjoribanks, Junior, held on the 3d April last, there was a double return in favour of Mr. Claud Russell, Accountant in Edinburgh, and the Subscriber, William Muir, Merchant in Leith. The Subscriber had the majority of votes, and applied to the Court of Session for confirmation of his appointment. His petition was appointed to be intimated to Mr. Russell, and his Agent, Mr. James Pedie, W. S., and they were ordained forthwith to lodge in the Clerk's hands the minutes of election. After some delay, the minutes were lodged, and no application for confirmation having been made on behalf of Mr. Russell, the Subscriber's appointment was confirmed. The statutory meeting of the Creditors, for the purpose of electing Commissioners and instructing the Trustee, was held upon the 26th of May current. At this meeting Mr. Thomas Mansfield, Accountant in Edinburgh, Mr. Henry Raeburn of St. Bernard's, and Mr. Robert Ramsay, W. S. were declared to be Commissioners, under an objection to Mr. Raeburn's appointment. Mr. Mansfield as a Commissioner, and as acting for certain Creditors, and Mr. Raeburn for himself, requested the Subscriber, as Trustee, to call a general meeting for the purpose of removing the present, and electing a new Trustee; against which requisition the Subscriber protested. Before the meeting broke up, Mr. James Pedie, W. S. wrote the following Letter, to which he procured the signature of Mr. Mansfield and Mr. Raeburn; and having afterwards procured Mr. Ramsay's signature, the Letter was received by the Subscriber by the penny post of Tuesday morning the 27th current. The Letter is in these terms:—"Edinburgh, 26th May 1828.—To Mr Wm. Muir, Merchant, Leith.—SIR, We hereby request you, with the least possible delay, to call a general meeting of the Creditors of Alexander Marjoribanks, Junior, Builder in Edinburgh, in terms of the Statute, for the purpose of removing the present Trustee on his estate, and electing a new one in his place. In consequence, therefore, of this requisition, the Subscriber intimates, that those who have been declared Commissioners request a general meeting of the Creditors to be held within the Royal Exchange Coffeehouse, on Friday the 13th day of June next, at two o'clock afternoon, for the purposes set forth in the above Letter,—saving always and reserving all objections to the competency, or legality, of such course of proceedings.
