St. JAMES'S-PALACE, April 29, 1829.

This day had private audiences of His Majesty

HIS Highness the Prince of Lieven, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of All the Russias, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign;

The Marquis of Barbacena, on a special mission from the Emperor of Brazil, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign;

The Count Moltke, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Denmark, upon his return to his Mission;

And the Chevalier de Zea Bermudez, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Spain, to deliver his Credentials as Minister Plenipotentiary from his Royal Highness the Duke of Lucca;—

To which several audiences they were respectively introduced by the Right Honourable Robert Peel, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon William Richard Cosway, Esq. of Bilsington, in the county of Kent, late Secretary to Vice-Admiral Lord Collingwood.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Captain John Franklin, of the Royal Navy, late Commander of the Northern Land Expeditions.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon William Seymour, Esq. one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Bombay.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon William Campbell, Esq. Chief Justice of Upper Canada.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Captain William Edward Parry, of the Royal Navy, late Commander of the Expeditions for the Discovery of a North West Passage, &c.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon William Anglin Scarlett, Esq. Chief Justice of Jamaica.

His Majesty has been pleased to approve of the 53d Regiment of Foot being permitted to retain on its colours and appointments, the words

"Salamanca," and
"Peninsula,"

in commemoration of the distinguished services of the late 2d Battalion of that Regiment at Salamanca, on the 22d July 1812; and in the Peninsula, from April 1809 to February 1813.

7th Regiment of Dragoon Guards—Cornet Robert Richardson to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Buller, promoted. Audley Lovell, gent. to be Cornet, by purchase, vice Richardson. Both dated April 9.

4th Regiment of Light Dragoons—Captain Alexander Houston, from the half-pay, to be Captain, vice Robert Ellis, who exchanges, receiving the difference; dated April 2.

6th Regiment of Dragoons—Lieutenant Walter Cope Sheppard to be Captain, by purchase, vice Orme, who retires. Cornet Robert Douglas Barbor to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Sheppard. William FitzHerbert, gent. to be Cornet, by purchase, vice Barbor. All dated April 9.

10th Regiment of Light Dragoons—Cornet Honourable William Horsley Beresford to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Musters, who retires. Charles FitzHerbert, gent. to be Cornet, by purchase, vice Beresford.

7th Regiment of Foot—Captain William Hope, from the 96th foot, to be Captain, vice Frederick Prosser, who retires upon half-pay, receiving the difference. All dated April 2.

22d—Serjeant-Major William Merchant to be Quartermaster, vice William Mansfield, who retires; dated April 9.

35th—Captain Robert Mortimer Cochrane, from half-pay Glengarry Fencible Infantry, to be Paymaster, vice Newton, deceased; dated April 2.

45th—Ensign Andrew Clendining to be Lieutenant, by purchase, vice Sykes, who retires. George Morehouse Metcalfe, gent. to be Ensign, by purchase, vice Clendining. Both dated April 9.

49th—To be Captains—Lieutenant Joseph Stean, without purchase, vice Danford, deceased; dated April 1. Captain Percy James Leith, from the half-pay, to be Captain, vice John Sewell, who retires; dated April 2.

To be Lieutenant—Ensign Averell Daniell, without purchase, vice Stean.

To be Ensign, without purchase—Henry George Hart, gent. vice Daniell.

To be Adjutant—Lieutenant James Simpson, vice Stean. All dated April 1.

53d—Lieutenant-Colonel James Considine, from the half-pay, to be Lieutenant-Colonel, vice Sir William Plunkett De Bathe, who exchanges, receiving the difference. Captain John Henry Baldwin, from the half-pay, to be Captain, vice John Steuart, who exchanges, receiving the difference.

60th—Honourable Henry Littleton Powys to be Second Lieutenant, by purchase, vice FitzHerbert, whose appointment has not taken place.
