WESTMINSTER, June 19, 1829.

**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for continuing to His Majesty, for one year, certain duties on sugar imported into the United Kingdom, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine.

An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs.

An Act to continue, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty, the provisions of an Act to allow sugar to be delivered out of warehouse to be refined.

An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to friendly societies.

✕ An Act for the more effectual recovery of small debts, and for diminishing the expences of litigation in causes of small amount, in the Sheriff-Courts in Scotland.

✕ An Act for directing reports to be made respecting gaols in Scotland.

An Act for authorising a division of certain commons, in the county of Caithness, and stewartry of Orkney, in which His Majesty has an interest.

And several English, Irish, and nineteen private Acts.

June 24, 1829.

An Act for raising the sum of thirteen millions, four hundred and thirty-eight thousand, eight hundred pounds, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine; and to appropriate the supplies granted in this session of Parliament.

An Act to exclude persons accepting offices in the East Indies, from being Members of the House of Commons. And several English and nine private Acts.
