Pursuant to the Act for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors in England:

THE COURT FOR RELIEF OF INSOLVENT DEBTORS,

On the 29th day of January 1830.

UPON the filing of the Petition and Schedule of **WILLIAM WATSON JEFFREY**, formerly of Lime Street, afterwards of Bow Lane, afterwards of Foster Lane, afterwards of 8, Priest Court, Foster Lane, and late of 6, Priest Court aforesaid, all in the City of London, warehouseman, a Prisoner in the King's Bench Prison, in the County of Surrey.
