Copy of a Letter from Captain Glynn, Commander of his Majesty's sloop Scourge, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Plymouth Sound, February 22, 1797.

SIR,

I have the honour to acquaint you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's sloop Scourge, under my command, at half past twelve P. M. on the 21st instant, the land bearing N. E. by E. distant five or six leagues, captured, after a chase of three hours, a French privateer called *Le Furet*, pierced for fourteen but only mounted ten guns, having the other four in her hold. She had on board, when taken, fifty men, besides twenty-two English prisoners, seven of whom were wounded; she is commanded by Benoish Giron, had been twenty days from L'Orient, is coppered, and a fast sailer.
