

EXCHEQUER BILL-OFFICE,
November 22, 1831.

THE Exchequer Bills dated in the Months of October, November, and December, 1830, viz. 5. Geo. 4, cap. 103, for building additional Churches; 1. Wm. 4, cap. 62, £13,607,600, 1830, with the interest due thereon, will be paid off on the 14th day of December 1831, when the interest will cease. Such bills will be received daily (holidays excepted,) from ten o'clock till one, until and including the 9th day of December, at this Office, where lists are to be obtained, containing instructions for arranging the bills. The bearers must endorse each bill with their usual signatures, and write their names and residences at the bottom of each list; and where the names of holders are inserted in bills, the bearers, not being such holders, must previously obtain their endorsements. The bearers must attend to give receipts for the payment.
