Extract of a letter from Vice-Admiral KINGSMILL, Commander in Chief of his MAJESTY'S ships and vessels at Cork, to EVAN NEPLAN, Esq. dated Polyphemus, Cork Harbour, May 26.

Please to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's sloop Penguin arrived here yellerday evening from Portsmouth, and that, in her way hither, she captured a French lugger privateer; further particulars of which will be seen in the accompanying letter to me from Captain Pulling.

Penguin, Cork Harbour, May 25. I beg leave to inform you, that on the morning of the 24th instant, being off the Lizard with a convoy bound for this port, I fell in with and captured, after a short chace, Le Terrible French lugger privateer, of four guns and twenty-five men; out feven days from Morlaix, but had not taken any thing.
