The Lords of Council and Session having this day resumed consideration of a petition and complaint for creditors, or doers for creditors, to the extent of more than one half of the debts due by Mr Robertson, against Alexander McKenzie, writer in Edinburgh, the trustee on said estate—“they appointed the petitioners to call a meeting of the creditors of said Wm. Robertson, in terms of the statute, to be held in the Royal Exchange Coffeehouse here, upon Saturday the 8th day of July next, at 12 o'clock noon, for the purpose of removing the trustee on said sequestrated estate, or receiving his resignation; and in the meantime appointed Charles More, accountant in the Royal Bank of Scotland, to be interim factor on said estate, with the powers specified in 15th section of the statute 33d of his present Majesty.”
