Extract of a letter from Captain Payne, commander of his Majesty's ship *Impetueux*, to Evan Nepean, Esq. dated at sea, June 13, 1797.

I TAKE this opportunity of acquainting you of the position of the detachment of the western squadron with me, by the *Zoeë*, a French privateer ship, copper bottomed, mounting twenty guns, (four of which she had thrown overboard in chace) and one hundred and twenty men; she was chased by the squadrons and captured by the *Phæton* the evening before last, and had taken nothing since she left Brest four days ago.
