

To the CREDITORS of

ROBERT FOGGO, Manufacturer in Perth.

AT a meeting of the creditors of the said Robert Foggo, held upon the 13th day of June curt. William Rankine, merchant in Perth, was chosen trustee, and his appointment has since been confirmed by the Court of Session; and upon application of the trustee, the sheriff of Perthshire has fixed Tuesday the 11th and Saturday the 29th days of July 1797, at eleven o'clock forenoon, for the public examination of the bankrupt and those connected with his business, within the Sheriff Court-room of Perth—of which intimation is hereby given to all concerned.

The trustee further, in terms of the statute, hereby requires such of the creditors as have not already lodged in his hands their claims and grounds of debt, with oaths on the verity thereof, to produce the same betwixt and the 8th day of March 1798; and that unless the same are lodged with

him betwixt and the said 8th day of March 1798; being ten months from the date of the first deliverance upon the petition for sequestration, the creditors so neglecting shall not be entitled to any share of the first distribution of the bankrupt's estate.
